Real Recovery at Hanley

To Our Hanley Foundation Family,

At Hanley, we believe recovery is not only about surviving addiction. It is about reclaiming health, family, purpose, and a full, vibrant life. This year's report is centered on that very truth: **Faces of Hanley: Real People, Real Stories, Real Recovery**. Every page reflects the real lives we see transformed every day in our prevention classrooms, treatment rooms, scholarship recipients, alumni, families, and supporters. Because of you, more people are finding a path forward — often at the moment they need it most.

In Fiscal Year 2025, Hanley continued to expand its reach in meaningful ways. **Through our prevention programming, we reached 122,972 students across 34 Florida counties, partnering with 392 schools and organizations** to help young people make informed, healthy choices and to stop the cycle of addiction before it begins.

For individuals and families already facing substance use disorder, access to quality care remains one of the greatest barriers to healing. **This year, Hanley awarded 342 Lifesaver Scholarships, opening the door to treatment for people who otherwise may not have had that opportunity.** One scholarship recipient shared, "I was given the opportunity of treatment that I could have never afforded...the support I got and continue to get from Hanley has truly changed my life." That is the heart of this work. Your generosity does not simply fund programs. It changes the direction of lives.

We also made important progress toward the future of behavioral healthcare. Hanley is in the midst of a transformative \$41 million capital campaign, which includes the renovation and expansion of our outpatient Resource Campus. With leadership support from generous donors, including Mayor Danielle Moore and Lesly Smith, this new campus will help create a fuller continuum of care for patients and families. **Scheduled to open in Fall 2026, it will include a coffee shop, bookstore, the Stoops Family Wing for family programming, and expanded resources for employability, alumni support, and long-term recovery.**

This vision is about more than buildings. It is about meeting people at every stage of the journey — from prevention and treatment access to family healing, recovery support, and life after care.

Our commitment to quality also remained strong. **This fiscal year, patients gave Hanley an average satisfaction score of 4.8 out of 5, and our Family Program received a 100% recommendation rate.** We also expanded services through Casa Flores, a new mother-and-baby program that gives more women a safe and supportive place to heal.

As you read the stories and impact highlights in the pages that follow, we hope you see what your support makes possible. You are helping students make healthier choices. You are helping parents return home to their children. You are helping families breathe again. And you are helping people recover not only their sobriety, but their future.

Thank you for standing with Hanley. We are deeply grateful for your partnership and look forward to continuing this life-changing work together.

Expanding Recovery for the Future: Hanley's New Blueprint for Healing

Set to officially open Fall 2026, Hanley Foundation's Outpatient Resource Campus renovation and expansion project is part of a larger \$41M capital campaign to transform and innovate behavioral healthcare. The project is aimed at creating a full continuum of care (from Hanley's inpatient care to outpatient care to transitional living to family and children's programming to Hanley's employability program and alumni services) that helps patients navigate each step in their journey of recovery. This unique model is designed to provide sustained, coordinated support through every stage of recovery, helping patients move from stabilization to long-term wellness while reducing gaps in care and strengthening outcomes locally, statewide, and nationally.

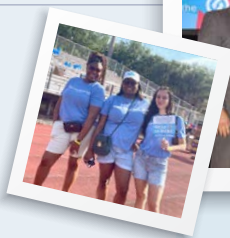

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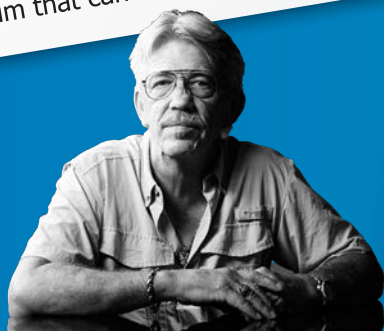
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Help Hanley Say "Yes"

to more people in need asking for our help

I have a son who is suffering from depression, anxiety, and an eating disorder. **I do not have insurance and cannot afford to pay for treatment.** Is there a scholarship available for him that can help?



I have struggled with substance use from a very young age. I was first exposed to drugs at 9 years old and began using marijuana, which progressed to Xanax by the age of 12. Over time, my addiction grew to include cocaine. In addition to substance use, **I have experienced significant trauma and loss.** While I was incarcerated, I lost my mother, father, and grandfather. These losses deeply affected me and contributed to my struggles with addiction.

Im looking for help with the cost of treatment. I have very limited income and **I am a full-time student and a single mom.** I've been a victim of domestic abuse which has caused severe trauma and dysregulation.



Please help save my son's life he's not going to make it.



I am a mother of a newborn and two young daughters, and my goal is to work toward reunification with them. I am ready to fully commit to a program and do the work necessary for lasting recovery. Currently, **financial hardship is my only barrier to getting the help I need.** Any support or consideration would mean everything to me and my family's future.

Looking for where to apply for the scholarship. It's for my brother who has no insurance, was in the ICU this year for substance abuse/alcohol misuse. Has since gotten sober and is severely depressed, and we just lost our mom suddenly. **He needs mental health care severely.**

I can't get into treatment im gonna die on fentanyl.



i really need a detox i dont have insurance dcf took my kid. i need help please. i wont let anyone down i just need to get everything out my system and **im scared ill die if i stay home**

I don't have insurance I need to go to rehab very bad **I'm over this and ready to conquer this demon.** Please help. Much love. God bless
